3. Care Network/IDS (slides 2-7)

- Lisa Williams opened, discussed mission statement and purpose of IDS – the working arm of the Community Action Information Board (CAIB).
- IDS consists of representatives from all Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Community support agencies. This is a “purple” organization which supports all members of all military branches represented and their families.

4. Resiliency Strategy Progress (slides 8 & 9)

- For REV's, the goal is for POCs to market to AD units, educate commanders, 1st Sgts & IDS agencies annually at a minimum. Current status for REV's is 6.
- Frontline Supervisor Training is at a 100% for required personnel. All E5/6s trained is 76%.
- Status for Resilience Pathways is 2,081.
- 18 MRTs trained.

5. IDS Initiatives (slides 10 & 11)

- IDS initiatives and statuses discussed.
- For Resilience training, collaboration with Sister Services for resilience program support is ongoing. Expansion of "purple" Spouse Resilience training and launch of "purple" teen resilience is also ongoing.
- For Resilience Pathways, fully implemented website with agency buy-in is in progress.
- JB MDL Resilience website and Community Action Plan are still ongoing.

6. CAF Funding (slides 13-17)

- Discussed both NAF and Appropriated funded requests from last year.
- Validated NAF proposals totaled \$18,328.
- \$99.1k was allocated to Appropriated Funded requests.
- For CY2014, funding requests will begin January and end on 31 March 2014. AARs are being requested from agencies who receive funding.

7. Suicide Prevention Checklist (slides 18-20)

- Suicide Prevention Checklist discussed.

8. Suicide Prevention/Mental Health (slide 24)

- For JB MDL, suicide stats remain constant for Navy, Air Force, and Marines. However, Army is trending up for both the JB and DoD.
- Challenges include no unified single reporting system; limited tracking system for DoD civilian suicides; data lagging behind at least one year; and Army data for 2012, 2013 does not reflect pending cases.

9. Substance Abuse/DDRDP (slides 26 & 27)

- Locally, Air Force remains constants while all other branches are trending down.
- Challenges: way that ETOH is presented on base in Class 6/shopette, or in media releases. The environment tends to glamorize alcohol.

10. Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program (slide 29)

- Locally, stats are trending up for Army, Navy, and Air Force.
- DoD stats are trending up for all branches.
- Current challenges include capturing data from all branches and staffing on-call roster.
- 24/7 hour Safety Assessment is ongoing.

11. Family Advocacy (slide 31)

- For JB MDL, Army is trending up.
- Current challenges include overcoming barriers to intervention and treatment.

12. M&FSC

- Mr. Hoover briefed IDS on the holiday Hearts Apart event and the increase in TAP classes.
- For EFMP, Mr. Hoover indicated, based on increased usage and feedback, that he is seeing more trust in the EFMP program.

13. HAWC

- Ms Rhodes provided a flyer for the weight loss challenge (flyer was also forwarded to IDS team).

14. Chaplin

- Chaplain David discussed the Prayer breakfast is in the planning stages tentatively scheduled for May.

15. 514th Airmen & Family Readiness

- Ms Pates updated the TAP requirement for Guard and Reserve and noted that one day each month the VA would be at the 514th and there are 50 slots total with about half available. Typically they are on the Friday before a Drill weekend.

16. EO

- Mr. LaGrow discussed compliance information and noted that, based on the AFI, EO would provide updates for CAIB on a semi-annual basis.

17. Army

- CSM Whittaker announced his replacement and that he would assist in the transition with IDS and the new ASA CSM Rick Anderson.
- CSM Parsons also provided his replacement's information for a summer turnover- CSM Steve Campbell.
99th RSC's Mr. Wade provided a flyer and information on ASIST training available through the 99th RSC.

18. USO

- Ms Flammer provided a report on assistance provided to service members and families over the holidays to include gift cards, toys, and food. 2000+ stockings were sent to deployed service members and 25 Airmen at ACRC received a free movie while located on the installation over the holidays.

19. Old Business

- Addition of dedicated slide for Chapel, MFSC, and HAWC (slides 36-38).
- New trending format slide for CAIB- used in Dec CAIB
- Victim Advocate/Sexual Assault initiatives discussed.
