3. Care Network/IDS (slides 2-6)

- Care Network/IDS discussed.
- IDS develops comprehensive, coordinated planning for integrating and implementing community outreach and prevention programs; improves delivery of human service programs by establishing a seamless system of services through collaborative partnerships and coordinated activities.
- Membership includes representatives from all JB MDL functional communities, includes community support and readiness programs, quality of life programs, sexual assault prevention & response, family advocacy, mental health, health promotion, and chaplain programs.

4. JB MDL Resiliency Strategy Progress (slides 7-8)

- Current status for chapel outreach is 1,565 PAX visited/88hrs.
- Resilience Pathways current status is 3,527 for CY14 YTD.
- Frontline Supervisor Training is currently at 94% for required personnel and 86% for all E-5/6s trained.
- For CY14, 16 MRTs trained.

5. IDS Initiatives (slide 9)

- For Resilience Training, CY14 initiatives are g2g.
- Goals for Resilience Pathways are still ongoing.
- JB MDL Resilience Website is g2g.

6. CF Funding and CAP Initiatives CY14 (slides 10-13)

- Newcomer's orientation: Need a detailed update
- Single Parent Resource group: going to Dare to Dream to get some word out and subcommittee for feedback is scheduled for this month
- Deployment cycle: pre/post deployment family members are invited but can't be mandated to attend. There are 2 weekly on average. Key spouses are working with commanders for outreach as well as Hearts Apart and Give Parents a Break. POC is TSgt Cruz at M&FSC.
 - Look at spreading out deployment support events (Hearts Apart and Give Parents a Break on different weekends).
 - Pre and post deployments briefings offsite for family members.
- Civilian: Financial planning classes
- CAF funding requests were reviewed.

7. Suicide Prevention Checklist (Slides 14-16)

- Installation leaders, Public Affairs, and CAIB/IDS members were aware of and utilizing the Public Affairs Guidelines on Suicide Prevention and Suicide Prevention Communication Guidance Card.
- Unit leaders did partner with IDS members to provide services at the worksite to increase access and encourage help seeking with Airmen and their families.

- Commanders on the installation did consult with local IDS to review the results of unit assessment tools such as Unit and Human Relations Climate Assessments (UCA/HRCA), Support and Resilience Inventory (SRI), Air Force Culture Assessment Safety Tool (AFCAST), the NORTHSTAR Initiative research tool, or AF Community Assessment, and developed a tailored action plan.
- The following installation personnel were educated about the LPSP program at least once per current assignment: Commanders, first sergeants, supervisors, OSI, SFS, IG, EEO, JA, HC, MDG, and Mental Health.
- Policy memos regarding the AFSPP and suicide awareness messages from senior leaders were disseminated across the installation in the past year.

8. Suicide Prevention/ Mental Health (slides 19-22)

- Suicide Prevention program managers are scheduling to meet to focus on new initiatives and best practices.
- AF at risk AFSC FST training requirement is 99%.
- ASIST training is being offered again through the 99th RSC.

9. Substance Abuse/DDRDP (slides 24-26)

- AF specific: typically an increase in summer and mostly alcohol referrals.
- Army has seen an increase in self referrals & alcohol policy is being rewritten.
- 23-31 October is Red Ribbon Week for a drug free lifestyle.

10. Sexual Assault and Prevention Response Program (slides 28 & 29)

- Down slightly this quarter
- Vigil against violence on 8 October at 1800 hrs at the Fitness Center Track followed by a rally at the dorms. Open to all branches
- Issue regarding telephone operator when transferring calls to SARC/SHARP. The calls are transferred but there's never verification that the call went through. Operators need to be educated.

11. Military and Family Support Center

- Dare to Dream conference is 22 October from 1300-1900hrs at the Timmermann Center. Two speakers are scheduled are scheduled for that day.

12. Chapel (slide 33)

- Next marriage retreat is scheduled for 7-9 November 2014. There are 30 slots available. Location will be Mineral Resorts in New Jersey.
- Need a flyer for the retreat.

13. Army-ASA

- CSM Anderson indicated there are rooms available for cool down periods. Someone from FAP or SFS should be the one sending them.
- ASAP has victim kits as well and Red Cross has comfort kits.

14. 514 A&FRC

- Resilience update: 1 MRT and 10 RTAs and are now providing classes.

15. Alibis

- Guest speaker on 23 October: BG(R) Cornum- 2 sessions open to all.

16. Red Cross

- Pillow case project for 3rd-5th graders and focuses on being prepared in disasters.
- Suggestion was offered to market to Youth Council.

17. Spouse Rep

- Operation Homefront is hosting a baby shower on 28 October at 99th RSC- 60 slots.

18. ASAP

- 27th Take Back Drugs Day. This will probably be the last one.
- Offices have moved to 5616 Doughboy Loop.

19. Old Business

- Old business discussed including briefing schedule and Diversity Calendar for quarterly reports.

20. New Business

- There will be training located on ADLS for all newly assigned IDS and CAIB members. Fundamental orientation to the IDS and CAIB will be given, providing the learner with a greater understanding of the IDS and CAIB structures, roles, purposes, actions and expectations of members.
