3. Care Network/IDS (slides 2-5)

- Lisa Williams opened, discussed IDS including purpose, membership, and mission statement.
- IDS functions as the action arm of the Community Action Information Board (CAIB).
- The role of CAIB is to identify individual, family, installation, and community concerns and develop solutions. Next CAIB is scheduled for 11 December 2014.

4. Resiliency Strategy Progress (slides 7-8)

- For CY14, there were 5,803 individuals trained through Resilience Pathways.
- Frontline Supervisor Training is currently at 93% for required personnel trained and 80% for all E5/6s trained.
- For MRT Resiliency Training, current status is 16 MRTs.

5. IDS Initiatives (slide 9)

- Still working towards goal of coordinated marking & active recognition program for Resilience Pathways.
- JB MDL Resilience website is ongoing.
- 2014 Community Action Plan outcomes discussed (slides 10 & 11)

6. Updates to CAP & CAF Funding (slides 12-16)

- Briefed on revamping of JB MDL Newcomers Orientation and projected commencement of Single SM Newcomers Orientation.
- Single Parent Resource Group will commence monthly meetings, January 2015.
- CAF O&M initiatives totaled \$115.7k.

7. Suicide Prevention Checklist (Slides 17-23)

- Suicide Prevention Checklist discussed.
- Want to make sure people are encouraged to seek help. All agencies are asked to get out and help (big push for a joint effort).

8. Suicide Prevention/ Mental Health (slides 26-36)

- As of 2 December, numbers are reasonably low. An uptake in hospitalizations is not usually seen until after the New Year.
- Data is for all services activated. Unfortunately, data does not address Reserve and Guard for a more complete picture.
- Suicide stats for Air Force Reserve civilians up from last year.
- DoD has an uptake in civilian suicides but no good way of tracking that.

9. Substance Abuse/DDR (slides 38-40)

- For November, referrals for evaluation were consistent.
- The majority of referrals for the month were for alcohol.
- Illegal drug referrals in the past month have been for marijuana.

10. Sexual Assault and Prevention Response Program (slide 42)

- For the first time in a while, JB MDL is trending down (all branches).
- Big focus is sexual awareness month which is April.
- Still seeing challenges in receiving data across units/services.
- Uptake in sexual harassment (more people are trusting the system).
- The SAPR program will be partnering with mental health and ADAPT to do cross briefing to show how easy alcohol can affect decision making.

11. Family Advocacy Program (slides 44-46)

- For 2014, there was no particular uptake in any of the branches.
- Child abuse protection month is in April (ongoing).

12. Military and Family Support Center

- Emergency aid is stable across the board.
- Workshops ebb and flow.
- Transition Assistance Program is straight forward; participation numbers have not increased but workshops have.
- Goal for 2015 will be to stabilize programs before continuing to add additional programming.
- For 2015, TAP will implement the Military Lifecycle Model (MLC). This will begin a Service member's transition preparation early in their military career. The aim is to better prepare Service members and provide smoother transitions.
- M&FSC is requiring all its staff members to sign up to be good role models.
- For the month of November, M&FSC and TAP were 100% in compliance with the VOW Act.

13. Chapel (slides 41-51)

- Chapel holiday schedule and holiday workshop schedule provided.

14. Health Promotion Working Group

- Operation supplement safety was discussed by Rebecca Rhodes.
- OPSS website can be used to lookup information on different supplements (<http://hprc-online.org/dietary-supplements/opss>).
- Air force is now requiring installation commanders to have a working group. The goal is for the working group to push out the message on what is safe and what is not.
- m-NEAT is currently looking for new working group members. The working group currently has no 1SG rep.

15. IDS Collaborative Events (slide 53)

- Events reviewed.

16. Old Business

- Discussed ADLS training for all newly assigned Integrated Delivery System and Community Action Information Board members.
- Quarterly Diversity report discussed.

17. New Business

- New business discussed to include appointment letter and new requirement for mandatory members.
- Mandatory members are now being asked to provide a MFR explaining their absence.
