3. Care Network/IDS : (slides 2-5)

- Lisa Williams opened, discussed mission statement and purpose of IDS – the working arm of the Community Action Information Board (CAIB).
- IDS consists of representatives from all Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Community support agencies. This is a “purple” organization which supports all members of all military branches represented and their families.

4. Resiliency Strategy Progress: (slides 7 & 8)

- Chapel outreach hours were 439.4 for the 4th quarter.
- Resilience Pathways has doubled usage since 2013.

5. JB MDL Resilience Initiatives: (slide 9)

- Marketing for Resilience Pathways is still ongoing.

6. CAF Funding and CAP Updates: (slides 10-16)

- Currently, civilian total workforce engaged, healthy, and productive initiative is red. Lisa Williams expressed her desire to begin a working group for this by the end of month or beginning of February. Looking for individuals that can be dedicated participants. One of the areas of interest will be pushing the opportunity for resilience training for civilians.
- No major updates to CAP since December. Updates expected in February for Single Parent Resource Group, Newcomers Orientation, and Single SM initiatives.

7. Suicide Prevention Checklist: (slides 17-23)

- No changes to checklist since last month.
- Note: Everything in red is not bad, it just relates to IDS and CAIB.

8. Suicide Prevention/Mental Health: (slides 26-41)

- For psychiatric hospitalizations, stats were down in the 4th quarter. Another uptake is expected this month.

9. Substance Abuse/ADAP: (slides 43-45)

- ADAPT referrals are steady, not too high.
- For referral type by substance of abuse, alcohol is prominent.
- For total number per referral type, DUIs have gone up.

10. Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program: (slide 47)

- Instance rates have gone down; report numbers have gone up (good sign).

11. Family Advocacy: (slides 49-51)

- For FY14, CRB referrals were up and down but cannot be correlated to anything in specific.
- For CRB referrals by branch, Air Force had the largest number. Numbers breakdown how the base is laid out.
- DAVA contacts from October-December were added to slide (29 face to face, 14 after hrs).

- Completed training with SFS regarding strangulation assessment and lethality. If someone is strangled once, their lethality goes up 800%.
- Still doing desk-side briefings with all new incoming leadership.
- NJ State Police will be coming in to conduct an internet safety seminar for parents in February. Will be going over online predators, cyber bullying, sexting, over sharing, and general internet safety.
- Teen Dating Violence Awareness is in February.

12. Military and Family Support Center: (slide 53)

- Ms. Rader discussed Caregiver Forum. The Caregiver Forum is a purple program. It is open to all caregivers of wounded warriors, regardless of branch of service. Next forum will be held on 14 January.
- Single Parent Resource Group will have their first meeting on 30 January.
- On slide, items marked with an asterisk (Single Parent Resource Group, Re-Vamped Newcomer's Orientation, and Newcomer's Orientation-Single Focus) are Community Action Plan initiatives. The main challenge in the way ahead is implementing these initiatives.
- VOW Act is integral to the success of all service members. To reach 100% compliance, every step in the TAP Program must be completed for each member that is transitioning out. M&FSC is working hard to ensure 100% compliance by going through the process step-by-step.
- Challenges currently being faced are TAP Program compliance and Community Readiness Service Delivery Model compliance.
- For Community Readiness Service Delivery Model, the Community Readiness Consultants and Community Readiness Specialists that work at the MFSC are teamed up and assigned to all the units throughout JB MDL. They are responsible for going out to Commander's Calls, job fairs, and any opportunity within units and organizations to provide information and support to leadership and military members.

13. Chapel: (slides 55-57)

- Chaplain Hess discussed counseling issues and trends. For the 1st quarter, workplace issues are up.
- In December, chapel visitation hours were the second highest of the year (156 hrs).
- For attendance, Contemporary Service has grown 20% in the past 6 months. Children's Church has over 80 kids.
- Catholics have an RCI Retreat on 11 January, Confirmation Retreat from 6-8 February, and Soup or Bowl on 1 February.
- Winter Religious Ed courses will be on 14 January at Dix Chapel. This continues to be a best practice program.

- Chaplain Hess made mention of welcomed support from Chaplain Lawson, the new Command Chaplain at ASA. Due to his influence, Army chaplains are able to help on Wednesday nights which helps to increase scope of influence.

14. Equal Opportunity: (slide 60)

- African American/Black History Month will be on Wednesday, 04 Feb 2015. Event will be hosted by the 174th Infantry Brigade.

15. JB MDL Long Range Calendar: (slides 62-73)

- Long Range Calendar discussed.
- Format will be changing.

16. Old Business:

- Air Force IDS membership needs to complete training on ADLS. Please email certificate to Lisa Williams upon completion.
- Team building materials and handouts available at IDS center.
- Appointment letters discussed.
