3. Integrated Delivery System and CAIB: (slides #1-5)

- IDS develops comprehensive, coordinated planning for integrating and implementing community outreach and prevention programs; improve delivery of human service programs

by establishing a seamless system of services through collaborative partnerships and coordinated activities.

- IDS is the working arm of the Community Action Information Board (CAIB).
- IDS consists of representatives from all Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Community support agencies. This is a “purple” organization which supports all members of all military branches represented and their families.
- Slide #5 shows CAIB related information. In the lower right-hand quadrant, dates in red represent the new pre-brief dates.

4. Good News Stories and Hails/Farwells (slides 6-7)

- BOSS program’s President and VP have been elected and will brief in October
- Laps for Life: Event sponsored by E5/6 Club in support of Suicide Awareness and Prevention. Helping agencies will have tables and all funds raised will go to Stop Soldier Suicide Foundation.
- Farewell to CSM Anderson, ASA Dix

5. Resilience Strategy Progress and 2014 CAP Outcomes (slides 9-15)

- Resilience Pathways usage through 31 August= 2460
- Frontline Supervisor Training: current trained 96%. Classes run monthly
- Resilience: 25 AF MRTs in the 3 wings. Total trained to date = 3,881
- Tier 1 Suicide Prevention: civilians 96% and AD trained 98%
- CAP 2014 Outcomes: All green but Civilian workforce engaged- Civilian Resource Fair scheduled for March 2016. Team lead is Bettie Kuzmick. NG and Reserve magnets have been ordered

6. CF Funding: (slides #16-17)

- All funds have been spent- AMC dropped an additional 12.7k for AF specific family resilience and biofeedback equipment for Mental Health.

5. Suicide Prevention Checklist: (slides #18-23)

- No updates to the checklist.

6. Suicide Prevention/ Mental Health: (slides #25-40)

- Slide #26 shows psychiatric hospitalizations per quarter as 28 August 15. There have been 8 psychiatric hospitalization so far this quarter.
- Slide # 27 shows psychiatric hospitalizations for the entire year of 2014.
- Slide #28 shows psychiatric hospitalizations for 1 Jan-28 Aug 15.
- Slide #29 provides AF specific suicide prevention training statistics
- Slides #30-31 provide AF specific data
- Slides #32-33 show Navy suicide stats. For June of this year, there were 21 from the AD component and 2 from the Reserve component.
- 10 September is National Suicide Prevention Week, guest speakers will be Ryan Flemming and Andrew O’Brien. There will be an informal contest to see what service component has the most participation.

- Laps for Life Relay flyer was provided with information regarding the Suicide Prevention and Awareness event, scheduled for 11 September. Additionally, IDS Team support information was confirmed.

7. Substance Abuse/DDRDP: (slides #37-40)

- Slide #38 shows a comparison of ADAPT referrals between years 2013, 2014, and 2015. Numbers were up slightly from July but still well below June.
- Slide #29 provides a breakdown of type of substance abuse. No trends in terms of specific units.
- Slide #40 shows types of referrals, one being self ID, one Medical, one D&D, one domestic and one DUI.

8. Sexual Assault and Prevention Response Program: (slide #41)

- No report

9. Family Advocacy Program: (slides #42-44)

- Referrals are about on course with overall numbers- AF has the most referrals and the largest population, followed by Navy and Army. Marines had none.
- No trends for any services except Marines who are trending down.
- FAP will be collaborating with SARC for the Vigil Against Violence.
- October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

10. Military and Family Support Center: (slide #45)

- Slides provided short and long term outlook for events in the Protestant and Catholic programs.

12. Collaborative Events (slide #49)

- Suicide prevention programs, Vigil Against Violence and Relaxation classes were highlighted.

- MFAP issues are being submitted to TMT and elevated issues will go up to Army MAACOM and AF MAJCOM.
- Civilian support: A working group has been formed to work the Civilian Resource Fair in March 2016. Timmermann has been reserved, DJ and Therapy dogs are confirmed. The next working group meeting is 24 September 1500hrs.
