3. Integrated Delivery System and CAIB: (slides #1-5)

- IDS develops comprehensive, coordinated planning for integrating and implementing community outreach and prevention programs; improve delivery of human service programs by establishing a seamless system of services through collaborative partnerships and coordinated activities.
- IDS is the working arm of the Community Action Information Board (CAIB).
- IDS consists of representatives from all Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Community support agencies. This is a “purple” organization which supports all members of all military branches represented and their families.
- Slide #5 shows CAIB related information. In the lower right-hand quadrant, dates in red represent the new pre-brief dates.

4. Good News Stories/Hails/Farwells& Agenda (slides 6-9)

- Laps for Life: Event sponsored by E5/6 Club in support of Suicide Awareness and Prevention. Driven by SSgt Hansen and SSgt Batista and supported by AFSA Chapter 211 and the 5/6 Club Established two main goals going in: (1) bring the community together and (2) build PTSD and suicide awareness. We achieved both goals thanks to your support and the support of many organizations on the installation. Here are some statistics from the 11 hour event.
 - 27 teams and 16 individual participants take part in the event which easily exceeded the 300 participant threshold.
 - Participants completed 4,636 Laps which is equivalent to 3,708 Miles. To put this in perspective, this exceeds the distance from New York City to Los Angeles.
 - Total donations received is \$5,207. A donation will be made to StopSoldiersSuicide.org from JB MDL Armed Forces and community.

2nd Place: 621st Contingency Response Wing, completed 518 Laps,

3rd Place: 305th Air Mobility Wing "Team Ammo", completed 461 Laps

OLD BUSINESS: MFAP update and Civilian Support- Resource Fair

NEW BUSINESS: New JB CAIB slide, Guest Speaker: PA- Suicide Awareness Guidance, JBMDL Mission & Strategic Plan and Working Group for CAP

5. Resilience Strategy Progress and 2014 CAP Outcomes (slides 10-13)

- Resilience Pathways usage through 1 Octobert= 2780
- Frontline Supervisor Training: current trained 96%. Classes run monthly
- Resilience: 25 AF MRTs in the 3 wings. Total trained to date = 3,881
- Tier 1 Suicide Prevention: civilians 96% and AD trained 98%
- CAP 2014 Outcomes: All green but Civilian workforce engaged- Civilian Resource Fair scheduled for March 22 2016. Team lead is Bettie Kuzmick.

6. CF Funding: (slides #14-16)

- All funds have been spent
- New spending plan for FY16: IDS Helping Agencies will submit spending requests in support of CAP/Helping Agency Programs; CF Funds Working Group will convene once moneys have dropped, and 4009s will be completed to transfer funds to agencies

5. Suicide Prevention Checklist: (slides #17-22)

- Updates to training data were provided on the MICT checklist

6. Suicide Prevention/ Mental Health: (slides #23-26)

- Slide #25-27 provides AF specific suicide prevention training statistics
- shows psychiatric hospitalizations per quarter as 28 August 15. There have been 8 psychiatric hospitalization so far this quarter.

7. Substance Abuse/DDRDP: (slides #27-30)

- Slide #28 shows a comparison of ADAPT referrals between years 2013, 2014, and 2015. Numbers were down slightly in September from previous years and maintained the same level in August and September.

- Slide #29 provides a breakdown of type of substance abuse. No trends in terms of specific units.
- Slide #30 shows types of referrals, one being self ID, one domestic and two DUI.

8. Sexual Assault and Prevention Response Program: (slide #31-32)

- USMC has had no reports of sexual assault in FY15
- Alcohol involved cases are in 83% and sexual harassment in 88% of all cases
- Mission impact: Client away from work due to interviews, medical appointments and legal counseling as well as case management takes 6-18 months with investigations lasting 3-6 months.
- Contributing factors: alcohol use by accused and/or victim and sexual harassment
- Current action: Vigil Against Violence in collaboration with FAP and partnering with EO to develop campaign against sexual harassment in units, fitness centers and dorms
- Recommendations to CAIB include using Team Teal for training and identifying focus areas for marketing and training
- Slide 33- New Sexual Assault Prevention Strategy released by USAF-
 - Requires a local board, such as the IDS/CAIB, make local decisions and provide support for prevention activities.
 - Wing or Installation Commander or Vice Commander will determine whether to use the IDS/CAIB, create a subcommittee of the IDS/CAIB, or create a new board to meet this requirement.
 - **All activities must be completed by the end of CY 2015** and implementers for the bystander intervention program, must be identified by 1 December 2015.
 - What this means:
 - Strategy must be a board effort, cannot be completed by SARC
 - Board must be formed and functioning by 1 NOV in order to complete the Installation Profile and Strategy

9. Family Advocacy Program: (slides #34-37)

- Referrals are about on course with overall numbers- AF has the most referrals and the largest population, followed by Navy and Army. Marines had none.
- No trends for any services
- DAVA contacts: 22 after hour contacts, 12 court accompaniments, 2 new clients and 4 on-going clients
- The way ahead: desk side briefings for all new incoming leadership; October DV Awareness month and Vigil against Violence with SARC
- Slide 36- Annual Leadership training for all Services is scheduled for 2 November 0800-1200hrs. at the Timmermann
- Slide 37- Vigil Against Violence flyer
