3. Integrated Delivery System and CAIB: (slides #1-5)

- IDS develops comprehensive, coordinated planning for integrating and implementing community outreach and prevention programs; improve delivery of human service programs

by establishing a seamless system of services through collaborative partnerships and coordinated activities.

- IDS is the working arm of the Community Action Information Board (CAIB).
- IDS consists of representatives from all Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Community support agencies. This is a “purple” organization which supports all members of all military branches represented and their families.

5. Resilience Strategy Progress and 2014 CAP Outcomes (slides 9-15)

- Resilience Pathways usage through 3 November= 9019
- Frontline Supervisor Training: 99% required (at risk AFSC 3P, 1N, 2A) personnel trained. Current trained-Still reporting. Training for all E5-6 is no longer required Classes run monthly
- Resilience: 26 AF MRTs in the 3 wings. Total trained to date = 3,881
- Tier 1 Suicide Prevention: civilians 99% and AD trained 99.7%
- CAP 2014 Outcomes: All green but Civilian workforce engaged- Civilian Resource Fair scheduled for 22 March 2016. Team lead is Bettie Kuzmick. NG and Reserve magnets have been ordered

- All funds have been spent- AMC dropped an additional 12.7k for AF specific family resilience and biofeedback equipment for Mental Health.
