1. Good News Stories and Hails/Farewells (slide 2)

- Partnership with EFM programs and SFS
- No major Safety mishaps reported during the holiday season
- Jackly Urmey had a healthy baby boy
- Great collaborations for the STEM Expo and Fall Comprehensive Fitness Day

4. Resilience Strategy Progress and 2014 CAP Outcomes (slides 5-8)

- Resilience Pathways usage through EOY15= 9579
- Frontline Supervisor Training: 96% required (at risk AFSC 3P, 1N, 2A) personnel trained. 662 completed initial F2F training and 538 completed CBT.
- Resilience: 26 AF MRTs in the 3 wings. Total trained to date = 4727 - 96% trained installation wide
- Tier 1 Suicide Prevention: civilians 100% and AD trained 100% meeting the required training goal.
- CAP 2014 Outcomes: All green but civilian workforces engaged- Civilian Resource Fair scheduled for 22 March 2016. Team lead is Bettie Kuzmick. EAP has been instituted for AMC which is open to all civilians whether Air Force or not.

5. CF Funding: (slides #9-10)

- CF Funds working group meeting is scheduled for 20 January at 1400hrs in the training room.
- Requests to date: STEM EXPO, EFMP trainings for SFS, Violence Prevention guest speakers for CF Days
- 4009s will be completed to transfer funds to agencies

5. Suicide Prevention/ Mental Health: (slides #12-24)

- Psychiatric hospitalizations were reviewed for the quarter and year. The numbers according to service component correlate with number of ½ day, PHP and Inpatient.
- Air Force, Army and Navy “big service” stats were also reviewed and discussed. The Army is moving to a monthly report rather than weekly as in the past. Concerns about increases in suicides despite new training initiatives were discussed.

7. Substance Abuse/DDRDP: (slides #25-27)

- Slide #26 shows ADAPT referrals 2014 versus 2015. There were no trends and numbers remained stable.
- Slide #27 shows total numbers per referral type for 2014 versus 2015. There was a spike in 2015 DWI/WUI, 8 of which were ANG units.
- AA lists for Central and South Jersey were provided.

8. Sexual Assault and Prevention Response Program: (slide #28-29)

- Discussion regarding alcohol involvement in 90% of JB MDL cases and 80% of cases having sexual harassment in advance of the assault were discussed. The Army has had sexual harassment as part of their program since 2012.
- There has been an uptick in sexual harassment with spouses. Discussion ensued on how to reach out to spouses.
- Discussion of the AF Green Dot Implementer training and Installation Advisory board updates were provided,
- SARC is partnering with EO to develop campaign against sexual harassment in units, fitness centers and dorms.
- Recommendations included utilizing Team Teal for training identifying sexual harassment behaviors leading to sexual assault and targeting excessive alcohol use as a safety issue in collaboration with ASAP, ADAPT, FAP and MH.

9. Family Advocacy Program: (slides #30-32)

- Referrals are about on course with overall numbers- AF has the most referrals and the large population, followed by Navy, Army, and then Marines.
- No trends for any services.
- DAVA contacts were 7 after hours contact, 3 new clients and 4 ongoing clients.
- The way ahead included desk side briefings for all new incoming leadership, February's teen dating violence month initiatives and April's Child Abuse Prevention Month programs.
- The Domestic Violence Victim Advocate phone number has changed effective 1 January 2016.

10. Military and Family Support Center: (slides #33-35)

- Slides #34 show information of the Veteran Career Summit and purpose and intent was provided. Day 1 will have panels, resume reviews and classes for lead up. 250+ employers will be in attendance and will probably be held in one of the hangers.
- EFMP/SLS slide included an update on the EFMP process improvement plan which consisted of JBMDL Parent Forums, SFS Elopement awareness training and the EFMP Quarterly Council. The Parent forums allow parents to have crosstalk, speak with MDG, MFSC EFM support and SLS. MoS has become involved and a tax lawyer will come next month. There was discussion regarding the sensitivity training for elopement issues with SFS. The EFMP Council meets quarterly with MDG, MFSC personnel, Legal, PA, CE and SLS. The SLS Superintendent's meeting is 21 January and there are currently two vacant SLS positions.
- A note was made of the back up slides with additional information on all upcoming events.

11. Chapel: (slides #36-37)

- Slide provided information regarding Financial Peace University course being offered beginning in January.

12. Collaborative Events (slide #38)

- JBMDL Civilian Resource Fair-IDS Team along with Community Agencies-22 Mar 16; STEM Expo sponsored by the 305 AMW and supported by the Diversity team and Installation Comprehensive Fitness Day scheduled for 21 October.

13. Around the Room

- ASA: Susan Hicks was with ASA but is now with MH.
- 77th SB: Programming for youth is now under 4H as Operation Military Kids is no longer funded.
- Military Saves: last week of February. Discussion on how to improve participation and the tie in of suicides with relationship and financial issues.
- Active Parenting of Teens: starts 4 February at the IDS center and 11 February has a Teens in Action class at the Dix Teen Center.
- MoS: Entrepreneurship 101 will start again next month as well as Financial 101 webinars
- Town Halls- question when the next one would be held. None are currently scheduled.
- BOSS Program overview: single servicemembers programs need to align. The Army has provided 15 Pacs for trips for the BOSS program. The Holiday Party on 23 December was very successful and had 45 military members attend. The event was supported by USO, key spouses and the Chapel provided their kitchen space. Upcoming events include ice skating, a Puerto Rico trip and skiing/snowboarding/snow shoeing type events. The meetings are held monthly and Facebook and Instagram are the usual means to push information. The BOSS program has gone from 3 to 70 people in 6 months.

14. Old Business: (slide #39-40)

- 2016 CAP date changed to 29-30 June 2016 and the working group will meet on 1 February after the IDS meeting to discuss focus groups and the survey.
- Civilian Resource Fair- 22 March 2016: a sign up sheet is circulating for anyone interested in being on the working group. Information sessions are scheduled for TSP, Good Sleep and Stress Mgmt. Confirmed participation from Virtua for blood pressure, spine checks etc..., therapy dogs and a DJ. Spouses' Club donated \$500. Incentive items have been purchased including lanyards, drawstring bags, stress balls and cards and stress magnet white boards.
- Installation Advisory Board: on hold until further guidance
- 2016 IDS Initiatives- job shadowing/immersions and monthly agency/unit overviews. Sign up sheets are going around for both.

15. New Business: (slide #41-44)

- Mid Atlantic Recruiting Battalion provided a unit briefing including mission, challenges and success stories. Information was provided on stressors including security issues at recruiting locations, previous command climate challenges and recruiting civilians RIFFed. Discussion on best means to support their challenges were covered.
